

EXCERPTS FROM LETTERS FROM MRS. EARL HARVEY (RUBY HALLELAND) AND MRS. J. W. ROCHE (VIVIAN FETZNER) MEMBERS OF THE 1918 CLASS

There were seven girls and one boy in that first class, which graduated from Colome High School. There had been a year or two of high school subjects taught prior to that, but this was the first to have four years and to produce a graduating class. It was during the first World War, so Sidney Pechota went to the Army. At graduation his empty chair was draped with the American flag and his diploma was left in it. They had promised him that they would graduate him and so his diploma was later sent to him. The sermon in the Baccalaureate service was given by Rev. Wilson of the Colome Methodist Church.

Emma Teutsch married Charles Coyle at White River. She is now a widow with grown children, and she makes her home in Rapid City, South Dakota.

Madeline Flint married Dr. Carle Lenker, and they now live in Winner, South Dakota. They have three children who also graduated from Colome High School. Madeline had a very pretty voice, and she did a great deal of singing. Madeline taught school after she graduated from high school.

Clara Van Meter married Will Huntington, and they reared a family. She is now a widow, and she lives in Oklahoma.

Vivian Fetzner is married and living in Minnesota. They have one son who is attending St. Johns University at Collegeville, Minnesota.

Gertrude Young attended Nebraska University, and then she taught school until she married Leland Fisher. They live at Fable Farm, Waco, Texas. Their hobby is raising racing dogs.

Ruby Halleland, now Mrs. Earl Harvey, taught school for several years. She reared a family of three girls and one boy. They moved to Winner, South Dakota, in 1951. They are staying with a daughter, Jeanne Eriksen. Her husband is working at KWYR Radio Station as custodian. Ruby works at Pilley's Produce Station.

Irene Hather married Sidney Pechota, the one male member of the 1918 class. They live in Omaha, Nebraska, but they are spending the winter on their farm near Colome, South Dakota.

The girls also had a basketball team, and they used to play down the line as far as Spencer, Nebraska.

As for the teachers, Irvin Adams had been the superintendent for three years before he was called to the service. Then a Professor Jones finished the year. He was a likable middle-aged man. The Latin teacher was a Miss Schow, also middle-aged. The other members of the faculty were Ruth Cummings and Mrs. Ethel Adams.

That was also the year they moved into the brick school building that is still standing. The west half was added later. Before the brick building was completed, all grades and high school students attended school in a frame building. The frame building was two stories high, and all together there were about two or three teachers for all the high school students.
