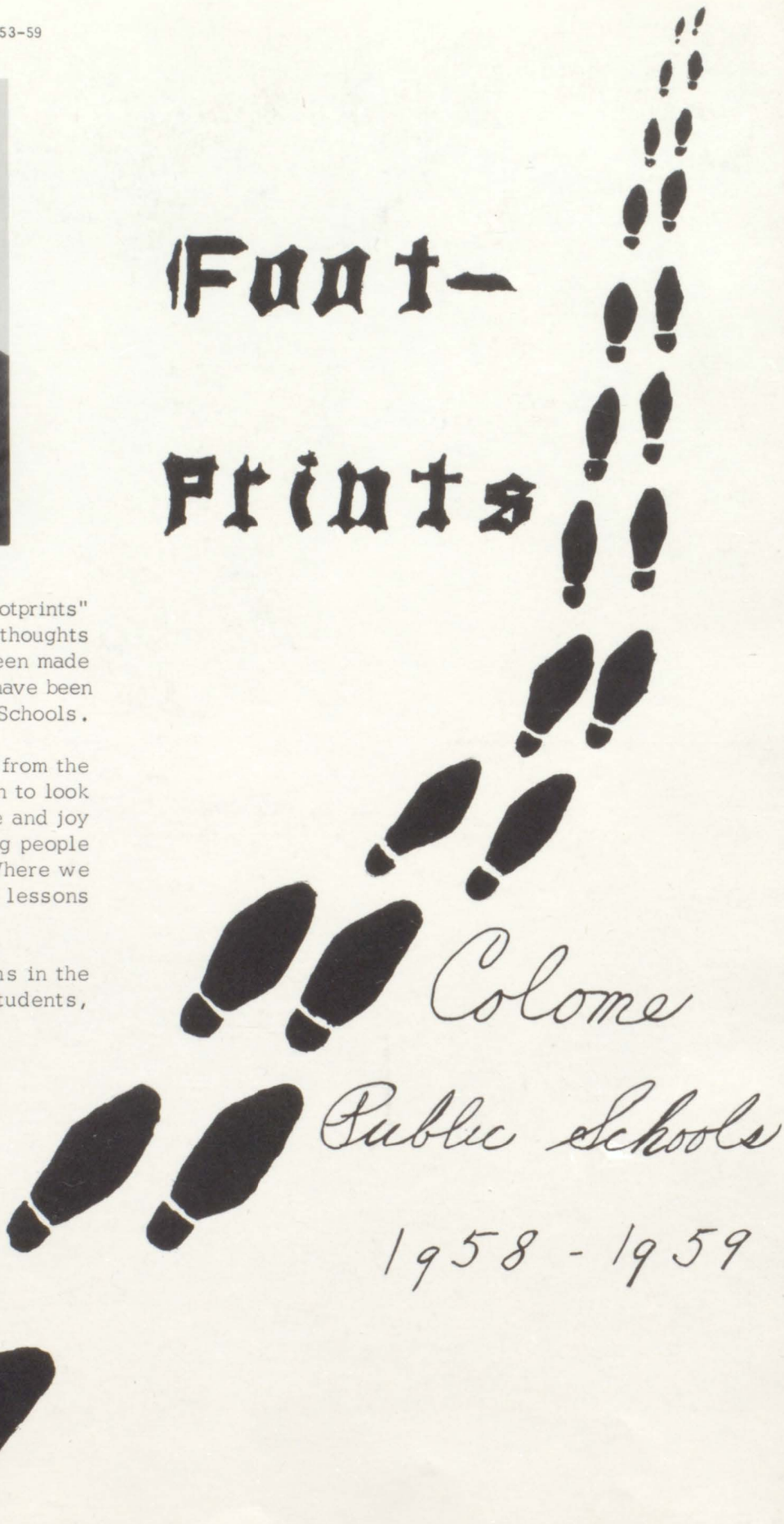


Foot- Prints

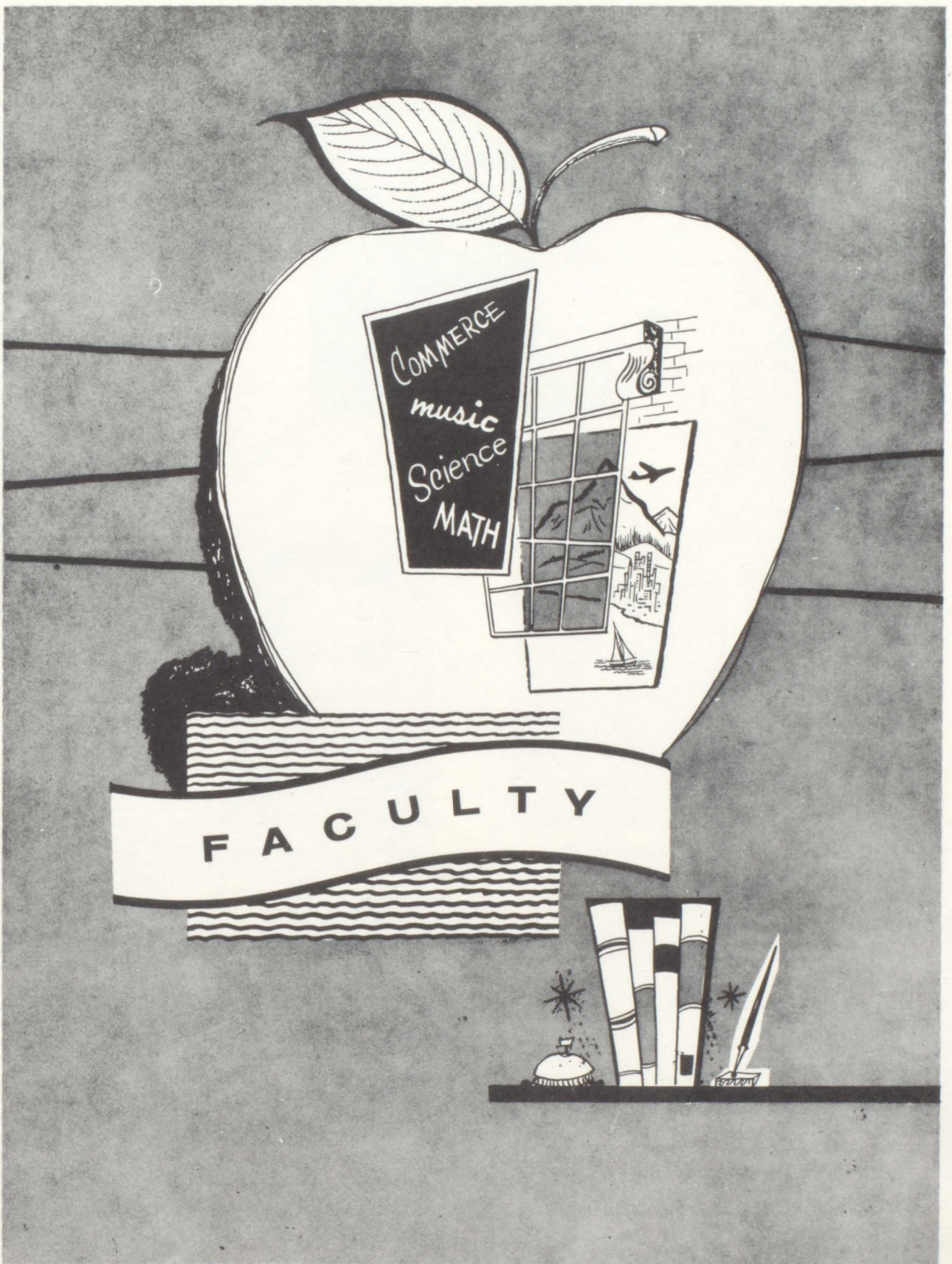
My best wishes for bright paths in the future go to the school: the students, teachers, and patrons.

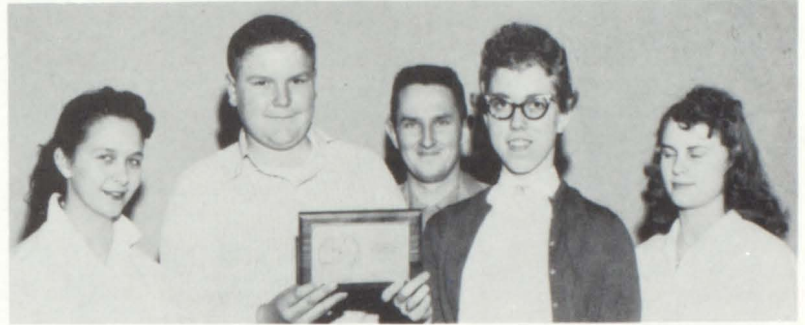
Other phases of extracurricular speech work also showed Colome representation.
