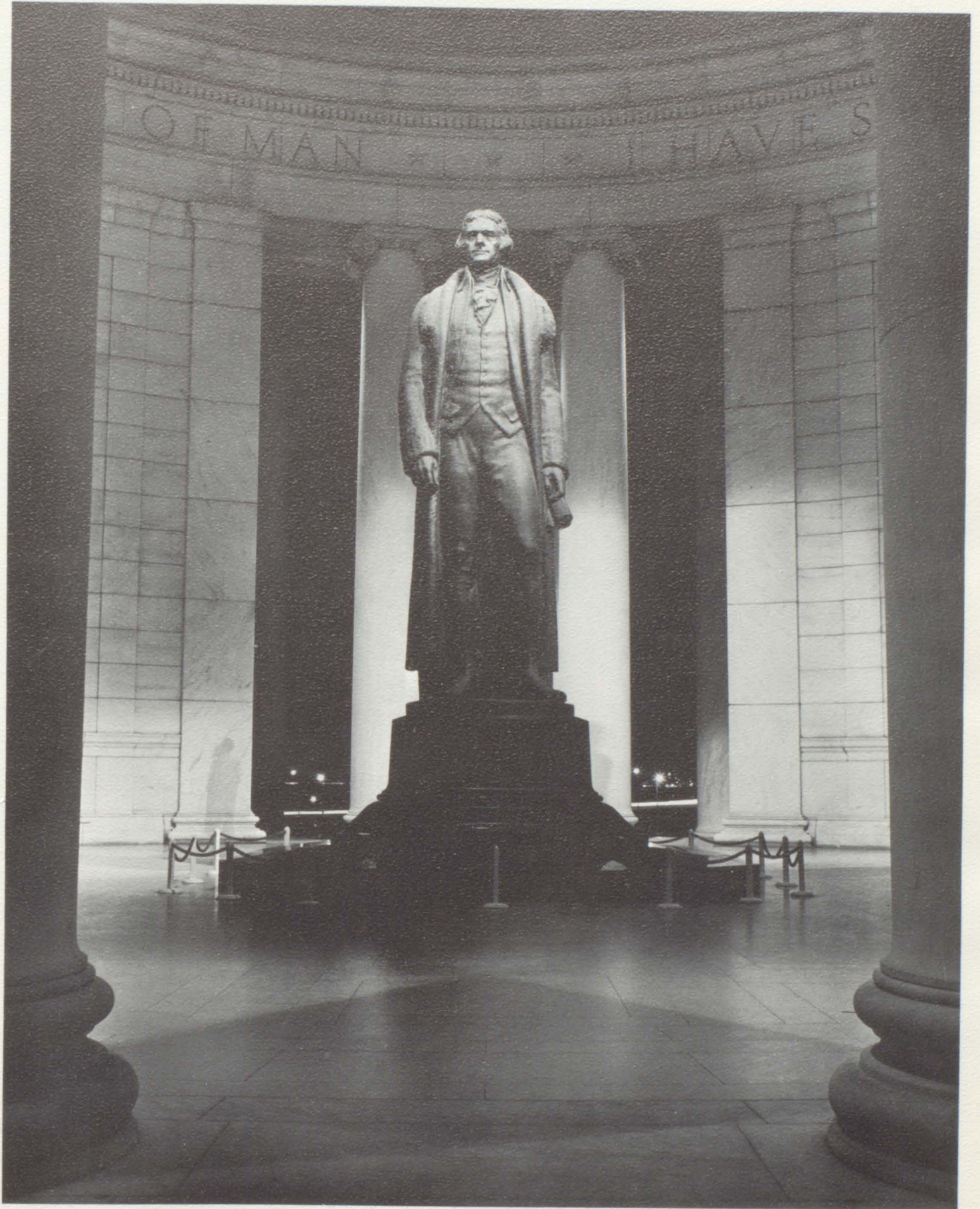


# CLASS PROPHECY
