The Board of Education is instrumental in the formulating of the school policy, organizing of school curriculum, and the hiring of teachers.

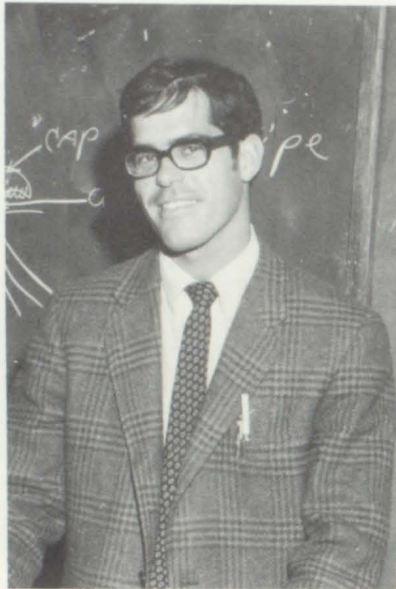



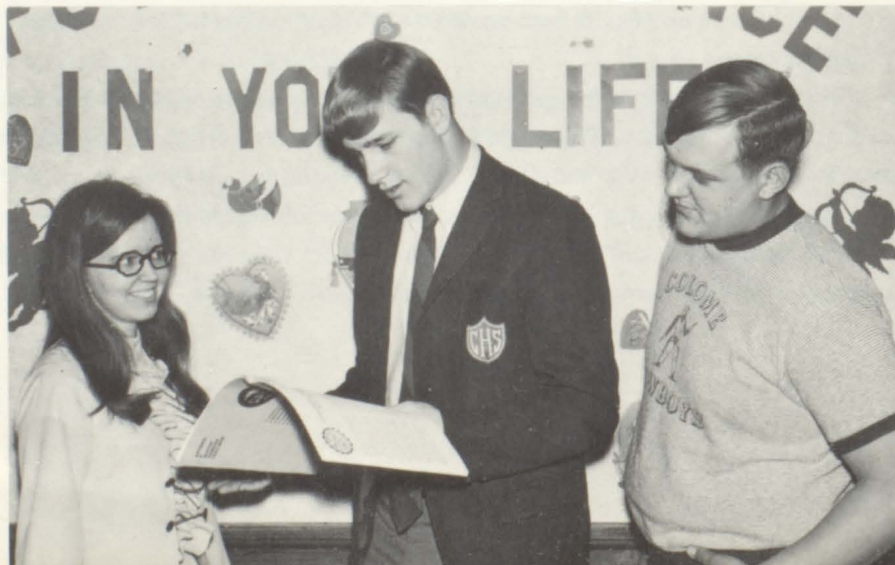
Class of 1970
