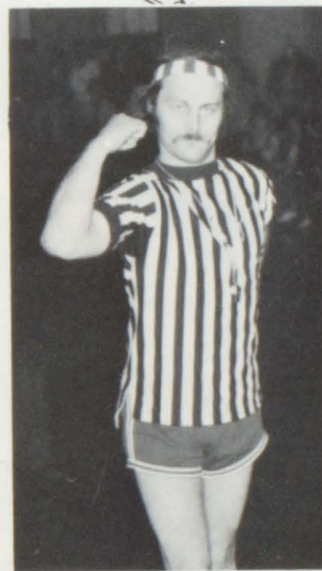






Senior teacher game
