This young group included Lori Broadbooks, Teresa Cole, Janet DeMers, Kevin Graesser, Lee Graesser, Diane Harter, Rick Harter, Pam Hofeldt, Stan Kalenda, Joan Lebert, Duane Lowel, Brian London, Gary Maier, Brenda Plas, Leila Pochop, Joe Rohde, Bob Cerv, Cheryl Shedeed, Paul Shanahan, Susan Steinke, David Tarrell, Karen Weidner, and Dale Woods. The class was led by President; Brian London, Vice-President; Kevin Graesser, Secretary; Brenda Plas, and Treasure; Joe Rohde. Our sponsors were Mr. Heibel and Miss Roper. We chose Cheryl Shedeed and Gary Maier to represent us on the Student Council. Homecoming was Oct. 1st, our float came in last place. The Juniors put on a prom with the theme "We've Only Just Begun." No freshmen can go through the year without some kind of initiation, our memories most often go back to the freshmen creed known as TEETH! Bob Cerv left our class in the middle of the year.

Our Sophomore year brought us back more confident of ourselves and ready to meet another year, on August 29th, 1977. Brenda Plas transferred to Lawrence, NE. Leila Pochop transferred to Mobridge, SD. Gary Maier wasn't with us the first nine weeks, but joined us the second quarter. Mike Watkins also joined us during the second semester. Joe Rohde and Duane Lowel represented us on the Student Council, and our sponsors were Mr. Hybertson and Miss Myers. Homecoming was held September 23rd, our float done an about face and took first place with "Raid the Wildcats." The prom theme was "You Light Up My Life." The banquet was served by Lori Broadbooks, Joe Rohde, Janet DeMers, Kevin Graesser, Diane Harter, Brian London, Cheryl Shedeed, and Duane Lowel.

August 28th, 1978, brought us back into the halls as upperclassmen. Our leaders were Kevin Graesser, President; Duane Lowel, Vice-Presi-

dent; and Mike Watkins, Secretary-Treasurer. Joe Rohde and Kevin Graesser stood for us on the Student Council. Our sponsors were Mrs. Theiman, Miss McGinnis, and Mr. Brozik. We sold over \$3,000 worth of Magazines. Coronation was held September 7th, the royalty were ushered in by Duane Lowel, Joe Rohde, Kevin Graesser, Brian London, Cheryl Shedeed, Diane Harter, Janet DeMers, and Susan Steinke. At the Homecoming parade the next day our float took first place again with "Let's Brand the Tigers." We honored the seniors of 1979 with a prom entitled "Sharing the Night Together." The graduation ushers were Janet DeMers, Cheryl Shedeed, Diane Harter, Brian London, Duane Lowel, and Kevin Graesser. Mike Watkins left us in the middle of the year.

The rest of us were all found back for our final year at CHS. Mashelle Scadden joined us transferring here from Jefferson, SD. Our class officers were Brian London, President; Janet DeMers, Vice-President; and Kevin Graesser, Secretary-Treasurer. Joe Rohde and Diane represented us on the Student Council with Joe as Student Body President. Our sponsors were Mr. Grayot and Mrs. LaFave. At Coronation the Homecoming Candidates were Diane Harter, Kevin Graesser, Cheryl Shedeed, Duane Lowel, Janet DeMers, Brian London, Karen Weidner, and Joe Rohde. Kevin Graesser and Diane Harter were named Cowboy and Cowgirl. For the third time our float won first place with "Do the Fignewton on the Wildcats." The Juniors honored us with a lovely Prom—"We May Never Pass this Way Again." Brian London and Janet DeMers were crowned King and Queen.



In 1914 the Freshman class of CHS was organized in a small frame building which was later used as a rural home. In 1917 a new school house was built, a brick structure. The new building was filled in a short time, and in order to make enough room for new-comers, in 1924 an addition was built which also improved in looks, but as for room, by 1926 they were crowded again.

In 1918 the first Senior Class graduated from CHS. There were eight in this class. The next year the class of 1919 was the smallest class to graduate from CHS with three members.


