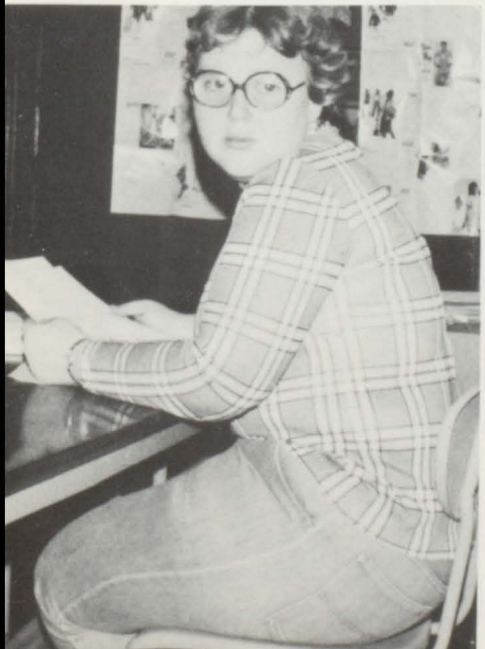
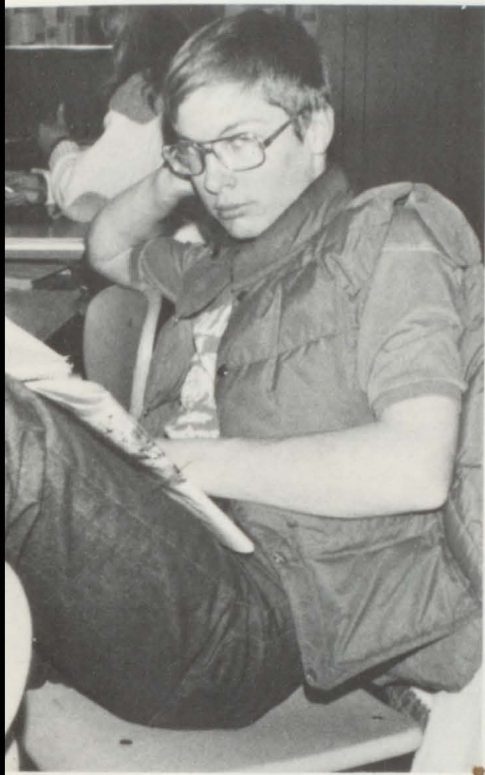


We, the staff of the 1981 Cowboy, would like to dedicate this yearbook to Mr. Greg Sherman.
