What's new at Colome School?


- In grades K-12 there were approximately 30 new students.





Students enjoy prom "Midnight in Paris"


The weather cooperated so that students could enjoy Prom 2009. With the threat of a blizzard looming, everyone kept watching the weather reports, but the snowy weather waited.


Once the spectators left the gym, it was time for the students to dance until midnight. Digital DJ's provided the music.







Mr. Brian London, school board president, presented diplomas to 18 eighth graders.









Hughes was the only one who charged all season.


The Cowgirls had 5 total blocked shots, led by London with three. Kartak and E. Graesser each had one block. Colome's opponents had seven blocks.

London pulled down 123 rebounds during this season, 51 offensive and 72 defensive. A. Graesser had 116, followed by 103 from Hughes.


The leader in assists was Beck with 60, followed by A. Graesser with 36, London with 34, and Hughes with 31.


Colome had 224 steals this year and held their opponents to 130. The leading stealer was Beck with 53, followed by Hughes at 51 and London with 43.



Winner/Colome Demons play in region championship







The regional competition was held in Pierre where Caitlin and Candace Shippy earned the right to move on to the state competition.




NHS held a white-out day in December. The students all wore white that day. They played Battle of the Sexes during SRB. The freshmen were also allowed to go downtown that day for \$2.

NHS sold daffodils in March to raise money for the American Cancer Society. Each bundle was \$10 and included five daffodils.







About 20 CHS students boarded a bus at 5 a.m. on Thursday, March 12, for a trip to Terry Peak in the Black Hills.


They arrived about 8:30 a.m. and checked out the gear that they would use that day. About five students chose to snowboard, and the rest rented skis.


